Tim: I'd like to send this package to Canada.

Emily: Certainly, sir. Would you like to send it by air or by sea?

Tim: How much would it cost to send it by air?

- (A) **Emily:** The post office closes at 6 p.m.
- (B) **Emily:** It depends on the weight.
- (C) **Emily:** It takes longer to send it by sea.

Jason: Hi, Joyce. Do you have any plans for the weekend?

Joyce: Liz and I are going ice-skating. Do you want to join us?

Jason: I don't know how to skate.

- (A) **Joyce:** You can borrow my gloves.
- (B) **Joyce:** I can show you.
- (C) **Joyce:** She'll be there at 10 a.m.

Melissa: Hello. Can I help you?

Henry: Hi. I'm Henry from downstairs. I heard a loud noise from your apartment. Is everything OK?

Melissa: Yes. I just dropped a heavy box of books.

- (A) **Henry:** Oh. Well, I'm glad you're all right.
- (B) **Henry:** Sorry. I don't have any boxes.
- (C) **Henry:** Sure. I'll lend you some books.

Laura: I heard that you're hiring part-time workers.

Jeff: Yes, we are. Have you ever worked at a music store before?

Laura: Yes. I worked in one last summer.

- (A) **Jeff:** OK. Let's go to the concert tomorrow.

- (C) **Jeff:** OK. Tell me about your new CD.
