Art Online

The Internet has had a big effect on our daily lives in many ways. For example, many people do their shopping and banking online. Recently, however, people have also begun to use the Internet to enjoy famous works of art that are in museums far away. Google and a museum in Spain called the Prado worked together on a project that lets people all over the world look at the museum's paintings using the Internet. Because of this project, many people now have the chance to see these works of art without (36).

First, experts at the Prado used special cameras to take more than 8,200 pictures of the paintings. After the pictures were taken, Google put them onto a special website. That way, anyone can view the images for free. The pictures that the cameras took are very high quality, and people can zoom in to see very small details in the paintings. This means that we can look at them (37) online than we can in the museum.

Then, in 2011, Google started a new project called the Google Art Project. In this, Google worked with 17 famous museums around the world. A camera was carried around the museums, and pictures were taken of the inside of the buildings as well as the art. This project allows Internet users to "walk" through the halls of the museums and look at art as if they were taking a tour. Just like the project with the Prado museum, users do not have to (38). Shoe Story

Many people around the world have been wearing shoes for most of their lives. In fact, many people are so used to wearing shoes that they cannot easily walk around outside without them. However, many thousands of years ago, there were no shoes. Researchers around the world have become interested in knowing when shoes were invented, and they have been learning more and more about the history of shoes.

Scientists think that humans started wearing clothes over 100,000 years ago. However, they say that we did not start wearing shoes until much later. Scientists compared the foot bones of people who wear shoes with those of people who do not. They found that people who wear shoes have smaller and weaker foot bones. The oldest foot bones like this come from people who lived 40,000 years ago in Asia.

However, scientists do not know what kind of shoes these people wore because none of their shoes have been found. In fact, the oldest shoes ever found are from about 10,000 years ago. These shoes were made from rope, and they were found in Oregon, in the United States. More recently, a small leather shoe from 5,500 years ago was found in Europe. Scientists think that this kind of shoe was made to protect people's feet from both the hard ground and the cold.

Some people, however, think that people in ancient cultures did not wear shoes only for protection. It is thought that they also cared about how their shoes looked. Manolo Blahnik, a famous shoe designer, looked at the leather shoe found in Europe. He thinks that different groups of ancient people probably had different styles of shoes. This might have made it easier for them to tell whether or not a person belonged to the same group as them. In this way, it seems that style might have also been important to ancient cultures.
