

## **Banned Gas Emboldens Smugglers**

The air-conditioning industry relies on HCFC-22 gas, a \*coolant, much like how the auto industry relies on gasoline. However, with the \*passage\* of the Montreal Protocol by industrialized nations many countries must \*sphase out\* the use of the coolant, which contributes to global warming and damages the ozone layer. There are now strict \*quotas\* on the import and sale of the gas in developed nations.

However, there are no such <sup>5</sup>ordinances in developing nations such as China and India. While <sup>8</sup>canisters of the gas <sup>7</sup>go for \$140 in the U.S., the coolant is a cheap <sup>8</sup>commodity in developing countries, where it is still produced in huge quantities. The Montreal Protocol had hoped to force the air-conditioning industry to manufacture environmentally friendly <sup>8</sup>alternatives. However, people are reluctant to purchase new equipment at a time of recession, so demand for HCFC-22, required to <sup>10</sup>service <sup>11</sup>aging machines, persists.

This provides a <sup>12</sup>golden opportunity for <sup>13</sup>smugglers, who <sup>14</sup>circumvent <sup>15</sup>customs laws by illegally importing the coolant, thereby <sup>16</sup>reaping huge profits. Officials are <sup>17</sup>responding to <sup>18</sup>rampant import abuse. European customs officials have <sup>19</sup>intercepted shipments of <sup>20</sup>contraband heading for Poland, Finland and Slovenia. Recently, a senior vice president of a respected appliance parts company in the U.S. was <sup>21</sup>prosecuted for making illegal purchases. As quotas for the gas continue to drop in advanced countries and prices continue to <sup>22</sup>spike, smugglers will only be further motivated.
