Must have to

We use "must" only in the present tense.

Ex. I must go now.

We can use have to in the past, future and other tenses.

Ex. I will have to go to school tomorrow.

I had to go to school yesterday.

Must all students study at home?

Yes, all students must study at home

Do you have to study a lot if you want to speak English well?

Yes, I have to study a lot if I want to speak English well.

Yes, we had to write a lot last lesson.

No, we didn't have to write a lot last lesson.

Will you have to learn English words for next lesson?

Yes, I will have to learn English words for next lesson.

No, I wouldn't have to learn English words...

How many times will you have to be here next week?

I will have to be here twice a week.

The verb “get” means “receive” in that sentence.

Do you receive more e-mails than letters?

Yes, I receive more e-mails than letters.
