We use **can** in the present and **could** in the past.

ex. I **can** speak English now.

I **could** speak English when I was a child.

We can use **be able to** in the present, past and in other tenses.

ex. We **were able to** build a bridge over the river.

I **will be able to** help you tomorrow.

She **has been able to** buy three cars.

What's the future of 'be able to'?

The future of 'be able to' is 'will be able to'.

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What's the past of be able to?

The past of 'be able to' is 'was able to'.

What's the present perfect of be able to?

The present perfect of 'be able to' is 'have been able to'.

Are you able to speak English without making mistakes?

No, I'm not able to speak English without making mistakes; I sometimes make mistakes.

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Will you be able to come to the next lesson?

Yes, I will be able to come to the next lesson.

No, I won't be able to come to the next lesson.

Would you be able to learn three languages if you had a lot of time?

Yes, I would be able to learn three languages if I had a lot of time.

No, I wouldn't be able to learn three languages if I had a lot of time.

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Was he able to come to the last lesson?

Yes, he was able to come to the last lesson.

No, he wasn't able to come to the last lesson.

Have you ever been able to run 30 kilometers?

Yes, I've been able to run 30 kilometers.

No, I've never been able to run 30 kilometers.
