ex. We were able to build a bridge over the river.

I will be able to help you tomorrow.

She *has been able* to buy three cars.

What's the future of 'be able to'?

The future of 'be able to' is 'will be able to'.

What's the past of be able to?

The past of 'be able to' is 'was able to'.

What's the present perfect of be able to?

The present perfect of 'be able to' is 'have been able to'.

Are you able to speak English without making mistakes?

No, I'm not able to speak English without making mistakes; I sometimes make mistakes.

Yes, I will be able to come to the next lesson.
