Does Friday always follow Thursday?
Yes, Friday always follows Saturday.

Does Sunday always follow Monday?

No, Sunday doesn't always follows Monday; Sunday always follows Saturday.

Is Christmas always on the 25th of December?
Yes, Christmas is always on the 25th of December

Is New Year always on the 1st of January?
Yes, Christmas is always on the 25th of December
