Does it ever snow in the south of Italy in summer? No, it never snows in the south of Italy in summer.

Does the sun ever shine during the night?
No, the sun never shines during the night.

Is Christmas ever on the 21st of December?

No, Christmas is never on the 21st of December;

it's always on the 25th of December.
