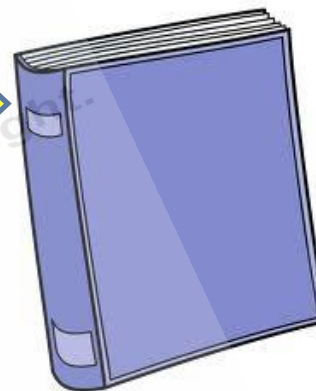
I'm taking my book to her.

I take my bag home with me after the lesson.



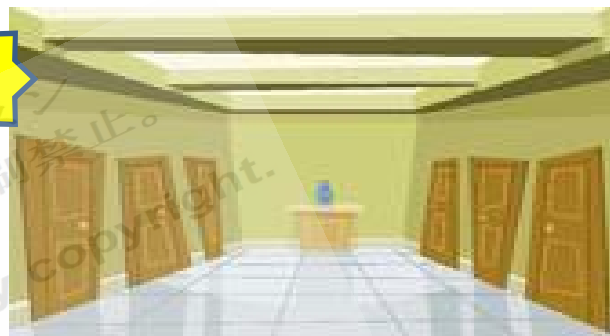
