Trouble in the Airport (1)

(1) Useful expressions

Is there anything wrong?	May I see your baggage claim tag?
My baggage has been damaged.	Here it is.
May I see your passport and immigration card?	My baggage didn't arrive.
Yes.	OK.
Here you are.	Thank you.
Oh, thank you.	You can go now.

(2) Conversation

My baggage seems to be missing

Traveler:	My baggage seems to be missing.
Officer:	May I see your baggage claim tag?
Traveler:	Here it is.
Officer:	All right. What kind of suitcase is it?
Traveler:	It's a big red suitcase.
Officer:	Okay. Just stay here. I'll double check.
