VOCABULARIES

1 Parenting / peər-ən-tɪŋ/
(verb) Provide for and care for during childhood

Ex.: Teachers should have parenting skills.

2. Motherhood /ˈmʌð-ərˌhʊd/ (noun) the state of being a mother

Ex.: Motherhood is fulfilling and a pride.

3. Fatherhood /ˈfɑː.ðə-.hʊd/ (noun) the state of being a father

Ex.: Fatherhood is a lifelong responsibility.

4. Biological / bar·ə ladʒ·ɪ·kəl/ (adjective) related through birth

Ex.: His biological parents were not known.

5. Single-parent / sɪŋ.gəl ˈper.ənt/

(noun) someone who has a child or children but no husband, wife, or partner who lives with them

Ex.: She enjoys being a single-parent.

6. Surrogacy /ˈsɜː.ə.gə.si/

(noun) the action of a woman having a baby for another woman who is unable to do so herself

Ex.: Some rich couples who cannot have children choose <u>surrogacy</u>.

7. Illegitimate / ɪl.ɪˈdʒɪt̪.ə.mət/

(adjective) born of parents not married to each other

Ex.: We are illegitimate children.

Useful Expressions

1. at your mother's knee - said about something that you learned when you were a child.

Ex.: She learned to sing at her mother's knee.

2. expectant mother - a pregnant woman.

Ex.: There are many good tips for <u>expectant mothers</u> in this little book.

3. experience is the mother of wisdom - this idiom is used to mean that people learn from what happens to them.

Ex.: You will never understand the love parents have for their children until you get your own children. Experience is the mother of wisdom.

4. face (that) only a mother could love - a very ugly face.

Ex.: Look at that poor girl. That's a face that only a mother could love.

5. the mother of all - an extreme example which is the biggest, most impressive, or most important of its kind.

Ex. Failure is the mother of all success.
