Vocabulary

1 Contaminate (/kənˈtæmɪneɪt/)
(verb) to make a substance or place dirty or no longer pure by adding a substance that is dangerous or carries disease

Ex. The drinking water has been <u>contaminated</u> with lead.

2 Biodegradable (/ baɪoʊdɪˈgreɪdəbl/)

(adjective) a substance or chemical that is biodegradable can be changed to a harmless natural state by the action of bacteria, and will therefore not damage the environment

Ex. All active ingredients of this soap powder are 90% <u>biodegradable</u> within 3 days.

3 Desertification (/dɪˌzɜːrtɪfɪˈkeɪʃn/)

(noun) The process of becoming or making something a desert

Ex. <u>Desertification</u> may intensify a general climatic trend toward greater aridity,or it may initiate a change in local climate.

4 Sustainable (/səˈsteɪnəbl/)

(adjective) Involving the use of natural products and energy in a way that does not harm the environment

Ex. Sustainable forest management is a good idea.

5 Toxicity (/taːkˈsɪsəti/)

(noun) The quality of being poisonous, the extent to which something is poisonous

Ex. Substances with high levels of toxicity are dangerous.

6 Thermal (/ˈθɜːrml/)

(adjective) Connected with heat

Ex. It turns out that what was going was a thermal runaway, when a battery begins a chain reaction resulting in smoke and fire.

7 Solvent (/ˈsɑːlvənt/)

(adjective) A substance, especially a liquid, that can dissolve another substance.

Ex. We need industrial solvents for removing oil.

8 Geothermal (/ dʒiːoʊˈθɜːrml/)

(adjective) Connected with the natural heat of rock deep in the sea

Ex. At present, little of the world's energy supply is obtained from geothermal energy.

9 Conservationist (/ kaːnsərˈveɪʃənɪst/)

(noun) a person who takes an active part in the protection of the environment

Ex. They will exhibit a meeting of local conservationists.



Useful Expressions

1 Disposable products – describes an item that is intended to be thrown away after use

Ex. disposable nappies

2 Coastal waters – of or near water

Ex. Many bays and coastal waters have been contaminated with heavy metals

3 Dumping ground – a place where something that is not wanted is dumped

Ex. The city's canals are used as a <u>dumping ground</u> for a range of toxic pollutants.

4 Oil slick - a layer of oil that is floating over a large area of the surface of the sea, usually because an accident has caused it to escape from a ship or container.

Ex. Large oil slicks were found near the coast.

5 Unleaded petrol – describes a type of petrol or other substance that does not contain lead.

Ex. Motorists should use unleaded petrol.
