Vocabulary



1 privacy/privacy/

[noun] the state of being alone and not watched or disturbed by other people/ the state of being free from the attention of the public

Ex. The new law is designed to protect people's privacy.

2 security /si'kjuəriti/

[noun] protection against something bad that might happen

Ex. My bag was emptied and searched when I went through security check.

3 hacker / hækər/

[noun] a person who secretly finds a way of looking at and/or changing information on somebody else's computer system without permission

Ex. Do you use any software to protect your computer from hackers?

4 intruder /in'tru:də/

[noun] someone who is in a place or situation where they are not wanted or a person who enters a building or an area illegally

Ex. I feel like an intruder when I visit their home.

5 confidential /,konfi'denʃl/

[adj] meant to be kept secret and not told to or shared with other people Ex. Your medical records are strictly confidential.

6 disclosure /dis'klouфə/

[noun] the act of making something known or public that was previously secret or private

Ex. Any public <u>disclosure</u> of this information would be very damaging to the company.

Useful Expressions

1 invasion of (someone's) privacy: an intrusion that results in the loss of someone's privacy

Ex. The athlete complained about the invasion of his privacy by the press.

2 (It's) none of your business! : If something is none of someone's business, they do not need to know about it

Ex. Stop pestering me; it's none of your business!



Idioms

1 stick your nose into sth (informal) – to try to discover things that are not really related to you

Ex. I wish he'd stop sticking his nose into my personal life!

2 spill the beans - If you spill the beans, you reveal a secret or talk about something private.

Ex. Come on! Spill the beans! What did he say?

3 behind closed doors - If something takes place behind closed doors, it is done privately or in secret, with no observers or intruders.

Ex. The matter was discussed behind closed doors.

4 good walls make good neighbours - This expression means that respecting one another's privacy helps create a good relationship between neighbours.

Ex. We try not to disturb the people next door. Good walls make good neighbours!

5 **keep a low profile** - Stay out of public notice, avoid attracting attention to oneself.

Ex. Until his appointment becomes official, Ted is keeping a low profile.
