Vocabulary

1 Technophobe (/ˈteknoʊfoʊb/)

(noun) A person who is afraid of, dislikes or avoids new technology Ex. This kid is a technophobe.

2 Breakthrough (/ˈbreɪkθruː/)

(noun) An important development that may lead to an agreement or achievement

Ex. It's a major breakthrough in cancer research.

3 Innovation (/ˌɪnəˈveɪʃn/)

(noun) A new idea, way of doing something,.. that has been introduced or discovered

Ex. Recent innovations in steel-making industry.

4 Progress (/ˈprɑːgres/)

(noun) the process of improving or developing, or of getting nearer to achieving or completing something

Ex. We have made great <u>progress</u> in this project.

5 Technophile (/ˈteknoʊfaɪl/)

(noun) A person who is enthusiastic about new technology

Ex. David is a <u>technophile</u>. He will buy the latest gadget whether he needs it or not.

6 Advanced (/ədˈvænst/)

(adjective) Having the most modern and recently developed ideas, methods.

Ex. Sweden has a reputation for advanced and stylish design.

 - (adj) Connected with electronic communication networks, especially the internet

Ex. cybercafe, cybernetics

8 Automation (/ˈɔːtəˈmeɪʃn/)

The use of machine to do work that was previously done by people

Ex. Automation meant the loss of many factory jobs.

9 Revolutionary (/ revəˈluːʃəneri/)

Involving a great or complete change

Ex. The effects of technological development are revolutionary.

Idioms / Useful Expressions



- 1 The cutting edge of something the newest, most advanced stages in the development of something working at the cutting edge of computer technology
- 2 State of the art using the most modern or advanced techniques or methods

Ex. The system was a state of the art.

3 Up to date - modern, fashionable.

Ex. This technology is bang up to date.

4 A computer buff – an expert computer user

Ex. They were a group of <u>computer buffs</u> who used to meet every Thursday evening.

5 Digital native - a person who was born or has grown up since the use of digital technology became common and so is familiar and comfortable with computers and the Internet
