Vocabulary



1 celebrate /'selibreit/

[verb] to do something special or enjoyable for an important event, occasion, holiday, etc.

Ex. Jake's passed his exams. We're going out to celebrate.

celebration /,seli'brei[n/ [noun]

a special event that people organize in order to celebrate something/ the act of celebrating something Ex. There were lively New Year celebrations all over town.

Ex. Let's have some celebration!

3 anniversary /,æni'və:səri/

[noun] a date that is remembered or celebrated because a special or notable event occurred on that date in a previous year

Ex. My parents will celebrate their 20th wedding <u>anniversary</u> in Europe.

4 tradition /trə'di[n/

[noun] a belief, custom or way of doing something that has existed for a long time among a particular group of people; a set of these beliefs or customs

Ex. It's a tradition in our family to have a party on New Year's Eve.

5 delicacy /'delikəsi/

[noun] something especially rare or expensive that is good to eat Ex. In some parts of the world, sheep's eyes are considered a great delicacy.

6 festival /'festival/

[noun] a special time or event when people gather to celebrate something Ex. Vietnam has a lot of interesting festivals throughout the year.

Useful Expressions

1 To propose a toast: to ask a group of people at a social occasion to drink to the health and happiness of a specified person

Ex. I'd like to propose a toast to the bride and groom.

2 throw a party: have a party

Ex. We're throwing a party next Saturday.

3 kick off: to begin something; to hold a party or ceremony to mark the start of something

Ex. They kicked off the celebration with a parade.



Idioms

1 ring out the old, ring in the new: to celebrate the end of a year while celebrating the beginning of a new one.

Ex. I don't plan to ring out the old this year. I'm just going to go to bed.

- 2 more fun than a barrel of monkeys extremely wonderful, enjoyable Ex. This is the best birthday party ever! It's more fun than a barrel of monkeys.
- 3 party is over happy time or days are finished

 Ex. It's 12 midnight guys! Party is over! Go home everyone.
- 4 paint the town red go out in the evening and have fun at bars or clubs Ex. John's idea of a birthday celebration was painting the town red so we all went to Happy Club Bar last night.
- 5 a wet blanket someone who doesn't like having a good time

 Ex. You should have even just one bottle of beer. Don't be a wet blanket!
