Reject /rəˈjekt/
 (verb) To say no to a romantic invitation. To turn someone down.

Ex.: Jessica Simpson rejected Brad Pitt's invitation.

2. Tease /tēz/

(verb) To playfully and jokingly make fun of and provoke someone because you're attracted to that person. 'A tease' is also a woman who leads men on.

Ex.: Johnny loved to tease Tess to impress her.

3. Significant other

(noun phrase) Your boyfriend or girlfriend. People refer to their couple as to 'significant other' when they don't want to disclose their marital status or sexual orientation. (also, partner)

Ex.: Celebrities would mum about their significant others.

4. Stud /stad/

(noun) An attractive, charismatic and popular guy who has no problems finding a girl to sleep with

Ex.: He played a "stud" in the movie "No Strings Attached".

Useful expressions

1. a match made in heaven - a perfect relationship.

Ex.: They're totally a match made in heaven.

2. to make up - to forgive someone after an argument

Ex.: We always make up soon after we fight.

3. to play hard to get - to pretend you're not interested in a relationship.

Ex.: Sally annoys all the boys because she plays hard to get.

4. pop the question - to ask someone to marry you.

Ex.: I remember he popped the question while we were eating ice cream.
