Basic questions

- 1 Do you often dream while you sleep?
- *Yes, I often dream when I sleep. / No, I think I don't often dream...
- 2 Do you remember your dreams? Can you tell me a dream that you remember clearly?
- *Yes, I sometimes remember my dreams. / No, I don't remember my dreams.
- 3 What was your nicest dream?
- *My nicest dream was...
- 4 Have you ever had a nightmare?
- *Yes, I sometimes have a nightmare.
- 5 Have you had a dream that is recurring?
- *Yes, I've had a recurring dream. No, I never had a recurring dream.

Extended questions

- 1 How do you understand this statement: "I dream of becoming a billionaire."?
- *This statement means...
- 2 Did any of your dreams come true?
- *Yes, some of my dreams came true. / No, none of my dreams came true.
- 3 Do you think that dreams may tell something about the future?
- *Yes, I think dreams sometimes tell something... / No, I don't think....
- 4 There is a saying: "Life is like a dream" Do you agree or disagree? Why?
- *Yes, I agree that...because... / No, I don't agree...because...
- 5 Do you think animals dream?
- *Yes, I think animals dream. / No, I don't think animals dream.

Vocabulary



1 dream /dri:m/

[noun] a series of events or images that happen in your mind when you are sleeping / something that you want to happen very much but that is not very likely

Ex. I had a very strange dream last night.

[verb] to experience events and images in your mind while you are sleeping / to imagine something that you would like to happen

Ex. I always dream of living in Europe.

2 nightmare /'naitmeə/

[noun] a dream that is very frightening or unpleasant/ an experience that is very frightening and unpleasant

Ex. The Math exam was a <u>nightmare</u> to me.

3 daydream /'deidri:m/

[verb] - noun: <u>daydreamer</u>; to have pleasant thoughts that make you forget about the present

Ex. I would spend hours <u>daydreaming</u> about a house of my own.

[noun] pleasant thoughts that make you forget about the present

Ex. She stared out of the window, lost in a daydream.

4 recurring /ri'kə:riη/

[adj] happening many times, or happening again

Ex. I had a recurring dream. That's so strange!

5 sleepwalk / sli:pwo:k/

[verb] - noun: <u>sleepwalker</u>; to walk around while you are asleep Ex. Some people may sleepwalk.

6 imaginative /i'mæʤinətiv/

[adj] having or showing new and exciting ideas

Ex. He is an imaginative designer.

Grammar / Useful Expressions

1 Dream of or dream about

Dream about : dream while sleeping

Ex. Last night I dreamt about my friend.

Dream of: imagine/want/wish; can also mean exactly the same as dream about.

Ex. He <u>dreamt of becoming a teacher.</u>

Last night I dreamt of my friend.

2 Dream on: You say dream on to tell somebody that an idea is not practical or likely to happen.

Ex. "You want me to give you 1000\$? Dream on!"

3 Dream (adj): is also used as an adjective and goes before nouns.

Ex. Dream house, dream girl/boy, dream job, etc.





1 a dream come true - when a desire is fulfilled

Ex. "My new job is <u>a dream come true</u>: the people are lovely, the work is interesting and it's close to my house".

- 2 living in a dream world to have ideas or hopes which are unrealistic Ex. "Stop <u>living in a dream world!</u> If you want to graduate you'll have to study harder."
- 3 broken dreams dreams or goals that may never come true

 Ex. I hope my future isn't filled with broken dreams.
- 4 Beyond one's wildest dreams far more than you could have hoped for or imagined.

Ex. "My holiday in Mexico was beyond my wildest dreams, it was perfect".
