VOCABULARY

1. grocery store / grōs(ə)rē/

(noun) a supermarket; items of food sold in a grocery store.

Ex.: I need to rush to the grocery store.

2. Fishmonger /fiSH mäNGgər/

(noun) a person or store that sells fish for food.

Ex.: You can get fresh cod at the fishmonger's.

3. Bar·code /bärˌkōd/

(noun) a machine-readable code in the form of numbers and a pattern of parallel lines of varying widths, printed on and identifying a product.

Ex.: All items have bar codes.

4. Cashier /ka SHir/

(noun) a person handling payments and receipts in a store, bank, or other business.

Ex.: A cashier at Costco, after five years, makes about \$40,000 a year.

5. Greengrocer / grēn grōsər/

(noun) a retailer of fruit and vegetables.

Ex.: This must be an expensive greengrocer.

6. express checkout

(noun phrase) For people buying a few items. The sign will show how many items you are allowed to have (1-12)

Ex.: Pay those three items in the express checkout.

7. automatic checkout

(noun phrase) You swipe and bag your own groceries and pay with a credit or debit card.

Ex.: You can swipe your card in the automatic checkout.
