VOCABULARY

1. Next-door / nekst 'dor/ (adjective) living or situated next door.

Ex.: Danny lived next-door to me when we were kids.

2. Neighbourhood /ˈneɪ.bə-.hʊd/

(noun) the area of a town that surrounds someone's home, or the people who live in this area

Ex.: We live in a middle class neighbourhood.

3. Contemporary /kənˈtem·pəˌrer·i/
(noun) someone living during the same period

Ex.: Franklin and Jefferson were contemporaries.

4. Traditional /trəˈdɪʃ-ən-əl/

(adjective) following or belonging to the ways of behaving or beliefs that have been established for a long time

Ex.: Most elderly people are traditional.

5. Conservative /kənˈsɜr·və·tɪv/

(adjective) tending to emphasize the importance of preserving traditional cultural and religious values, and to oppose change, esp. sudden change

Ex.: She is still conservative as she was ten years ago...

6. Conscientious / kan·ʃiˈen·ʃəs/
(adjective) feeling a moral responsibility to do your work carefully and to be fair to others

Ex.: She was a conscientious worker, and I'll miss her.

7. Trustworthy / trʌstˌwɜr-ði/
(adjective) deserving of trust, or able to be trusted

Ex.: Not even a newspaper always gives trustworthy information.

Useful Expressions

1. "Good fences make good neighbors" - Good neighbors respect one another's property.

Ex.: Good fences make good neighbors, like they say.

2. "Feed one's vanity" - to show one's social status

Ex.: This community feeds one's vanity.

3. "one's next-door neighbor" - the person living in the house or apartment closest to one's own.

Ex.: My next-door neighbor came over to borrow a shovel.
