VOCABULARY

 Feminine / fem·ə·nən/ (adjective) having qualities or appearance traditionally associated with women, especially delicacy and prettiness.

Ex.: His voice was soft and <u>feminine</u> opposite to his body.

2. Feminism / fem ə nız əm/

(noun) the advocacy of women's rights on the grounds of political, social, and economic equality to men.

Ex.: <u>Feminism</u> has become an important issue all over the world.

3. Maternity /məˈtɜr·nɪ·t̪i/

(noun) motherhood ; the period during pregnancy and shortly after childbirth.

Ex.: She will have a <u>maternity</u> leave for forty days.



4. Wife /wīf/

(noun) a married woman considered in relation to her spouse. *Ex.: The man has two <u>wives</u>.*

5. Maiden /mādn/

(noun) unmarried woman

Ex.: I saw a beautiful <u>maiden</u> next-door.

6. Lass /las/

(noun) a girl or young woman.

Ex.: He married a lass from Yorkshire.

Useful Expression

1. A woman's work is never done - Housework and raising children are jobs that have no end.

Ex.: After a difficult day at the office, Greta came home and began cooking dinner. "<u>A woman's work is never done</u>," she sighed.

2. Hell hath no fury like a woman scorned - There is nothing as unpleasant as a woman who has been offended or whose love has not been returned.

Ex.: When Mary Ann discovered that George was not in love with her, George discovered that <u>hell hath no fury like a woman scorned</u>.

3. A woman of her word - A woman who can be expected to keep or follow through with her promises or intentions; a truthful, trustworthy, or reliable person.

Ex.: I've found Mary to be <u>a woman of her word</u> so far, so I'm confident she'll get us the best deal possible.





Women's Day

International Women's Day (IWD) is marked on March 8 every year. Countries around the world celebrate IWD to give credit to the economic, political and social achievements of women and to show respect to their contributions in the development of their countries. The IWD was first celebrated on 19 March 1911 in Germany following a declaration by the Socialist Party of America. It's only in the beginning of the 20th century that the day was officially and internationally acknowledged due to the rapid industrialization and the social protest that it accompanied.

On this day women are usually given flowers and small gifts. It is also celebrated as an equivalent of Mother's Day in some countries. Children also give small gifts to their mothers and grandmothers. In countries like Portugal, it is customary, at the night of 8 March, for groups of women to celebrate the holiday with womenonly dinners and parties. In 1975, the United Nations gave official sanction to and started financing International Women's Day.

Although, women are becoming more powerful in business, entertainment, politics and many more areas, there are still a lot of inequalities around the world which call for the mobilization of everybody to grant women the proper status they merit.
