Vocabulary

- Sitcom (/'sɪtkɑːm/) (noun) A regular programme on TV that shows the same characters in different amusing situations *Ex. "How I met your mother" is one of America's most popular <u>sitcoms</u>.
 Intriguing (/ɪn 'tri:gɪŋ) (adjective) Very interesting because of being unusual or not having an obvious answer <i>Ex. That was an intriguing movie.* Comical (/'kɑ:mɪkl/) (adjective) Funny or amusing, because it is strange or ridiculous *Ex. He's known to be a <u>comical</u> actor.*
- 4 Dramatic (/drəˈmætɪk/) (adjective) Exciting and impressive Ex. They watched <u>dramatic</u> movie about wars on TV.
 5 Satirical (/səˈtɪrɪkl/)
- Satirical (/səˈtɪrɪkl/)
 (adjective) Using satire to criticize somebody, something
 Ex. It's a perfect example of a satirical magazine.

- 1 To be star-studded lots of famous people in a film, play Ex. It was a star-studded event.
- 2 On the stage working as an actor or actress in the theatre Ex. I'd love to be on the stage. I've always wanted to be in showbiz.
- 3 Steal the show win the greatest applause and to be better than all the

other performers

Ex. British bands <u>stole the show</u> at this year's awards.
