Vocabularies

1. Exquisite /ek-skwiz-it/
(adjective) especially beautiful or admirable

Ex.: This is the most <u>exquisite</u> present I've ever had.

2. Delightful /dɪˈlɑɪt·fəl/ (adjective) full of pleasure

Ex.: I received a delightful gift from the company.

3. Marvelous / mar·və·ləs/ (adjective) extremely good

Ex.: Children received a marvelous gift from Santa.

4. Priceless / prais·les/

(adjective) more valuable than any amount of money; precious

Ex.: That was a priceless surprise from her family.

5. Wrapped /ræpt/

(adjective) covered with paper or other material

Ex.: The gifts were wrapped colorfully.

6. Munificent /mjuːˈnɪf.ɪ.sənt/
(adjective) very generous with money

Ex.: He has a munificent family.

Useful Expressions

1. Have the gift of gab - to have a great facility with language; to be able to use language very effectively

Ex.: All good salespeople have the gift of the gab.

2. Have a gift for (doing) something - to have a natural talent for doing something.

Ex.: Tony has a gift for writing short stories.

3. Never look a gift horse in the mouth - If you receive a gift, do so graciously, without voicing criticisms.

Ex.: We should never look a gift horse in the mouth.

4. Gifting Phase - A period of one's life during which one's investment goals shift from making money to giving to charitable or philanthropic causes.

Ex.: Companies have a gifting phase every Christmas.

5. Gift wrapping - wrapping colorful paper around it.

Ex.: I usually enjoy gift-wrapping.
