

Lesson 1: Family Conflict and Discord

Practice:

<p>Conflict - an active disagreement, as between opposing opinions or needs.</p>	<p><i>Conflicts between parents and children become more frequent when the children become teenagers.</i></p>
<p>Discord - a lack of agreement or feeling of trust between people.</p>	<p><i>The plan to build the highway created discord in our community.</i></p>
<p>Suffocate - to die because of a lack of oxygen, or to kill someone by preventing that person from breathing.</p>	<p><i>The government warned parents yesterday not to let infants sleep on small plastic pillows because the babies could suffocate.</i></p>
