

Lesson 3: Hitting Devalues Parents

<p>Matter - a situation or subject that is being dealt with or considered.</p>	<p><i>I think this is a matter best left to the mayor to decide.</i></p>
<p>Conversation - an informal, usually private, talk in which two or more people exchange thoughts, feelings, or ideas, or in which news or information is given or discussed.</p>	<p><i>We had a brief conversation Friday.</i></p>
<p>Apologize - to tell someone that you are sorry for something that has caused inconvenience or unhappiness.</p>	<p><i>I apologize if I offended you.</i></p>

Dialogue Reading:

We need to talk.

Mom: I need to talk with you, John.

Dad: Why? What's the matter?

Mom: Ted is feeling bad and we need to talk to his teacher because of his misbehavior at school.

Dad: What are you implying, Angela?

Mom: What I am trying to say is that you keep on hitting your son which causes him to be a bad child. I mean he's taking it out on his classmates, hitting them.

Dad: Are you trying to say that, because of me, he's growing up to be bad?

Mom: I did not say that. But someday he will if you continue doing what you are doing to him now.

Dad: Then what are you trying to say?

Mom: John. Listen! I just want to ask you to please stop hitting your son, that's all! What you're doing affects your son's attitude and behavior.

Dad: He needs to be disciplined and you know that.

Mom: But hitting your own son is not the right way. You can talk to him about things properly. Ted is a smart kid. He can understand very well what you're trying to tell him.

Dad: So that's it?

Mom: You know what? His teacher thinks that we can't take care of his attitude problem. People will think of us as irresponsible parents. Do you want that?

Dad: Of course not!

Mom: Then you need to do better. Now talk to your son and apologize to him.
