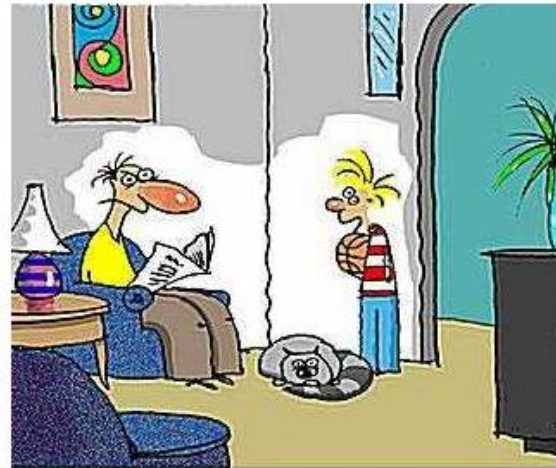


# Phrasal Verb 101: Lesson 33 T

Common phrasal verbs, with meanings and examples. Phrasal verbs are usually two-word phrases consisting of **verb + adverb** or **verb + preposition**. Think of them as you would any other English vocabulary. Study them as you come across them, rather than trying to memorize many at once.



"Turn up the volume. I can't hear a damn thing."

"I told my teacher that I won't be returning to school. I'm trying out for a pro basketball team, and her services are no longer required."

Verb	Meaning	Example
<b>turn something up</b>	increase the volume or strength (heat, light etc)	Can you <b>turn</b> the music <b>up</b> ? This is my favourite song.
<b>turn up</b>	appear suddenly	Our cat <b>turned up</b> after we put posters up all over the neighbourhood.

<b>try</b> <i>something</i> <b>on</b>	sample clothing	I'm going to <b>try</b> these jeans <b>on</b> , but I don't think they will fit.
<b>try</b> <i>something</i> <b>out</b>	test	I am going to <b>try</b> this new brand of detergent <b>out</b> .
