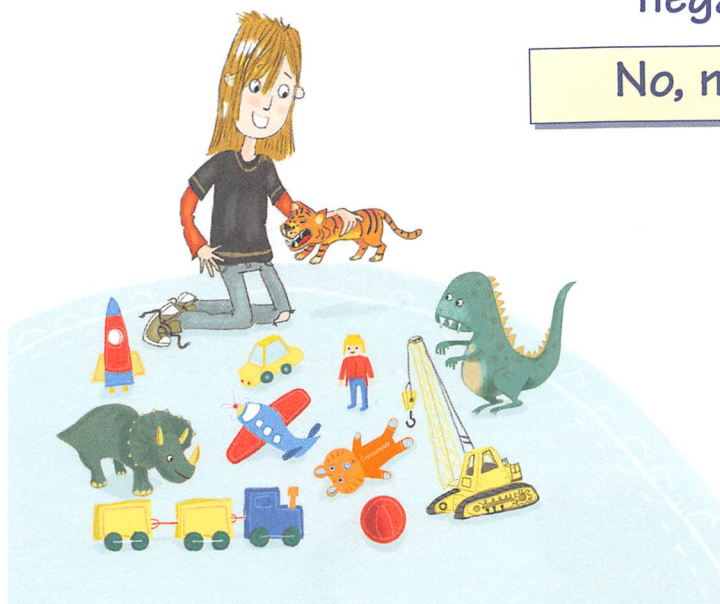

What is the meaning of the words “any” and “some”?

The meaning of the words “any” and “some” is ...

Are there any books on the table?

Yes, there are some books on the table

Are there any chairs in this room?

Yes, there are some chairs in this room

Have you got any shoes on your feet?

Yes, I've got some shoes on my feet

Has this boy got any toys?

Yes, that boy's got some toys

any?

no, not any

"any" in negative sentences



Are there any books on the floor?

No, there aren't any books on the floor

Are there any animals in this room?

No, there aren't any animals in this room

Are there any chairs on the table?

No, there aren't any chairs on the table

Has this boy got any toys?

No, that boy hasn't got any toys

What's the difference between "any" and "some"?

The difference between "any" and "some" is that we use "any" in questions and negative sentences, and we use "some" in positive sentences

Ask him a question with the word "any", please.

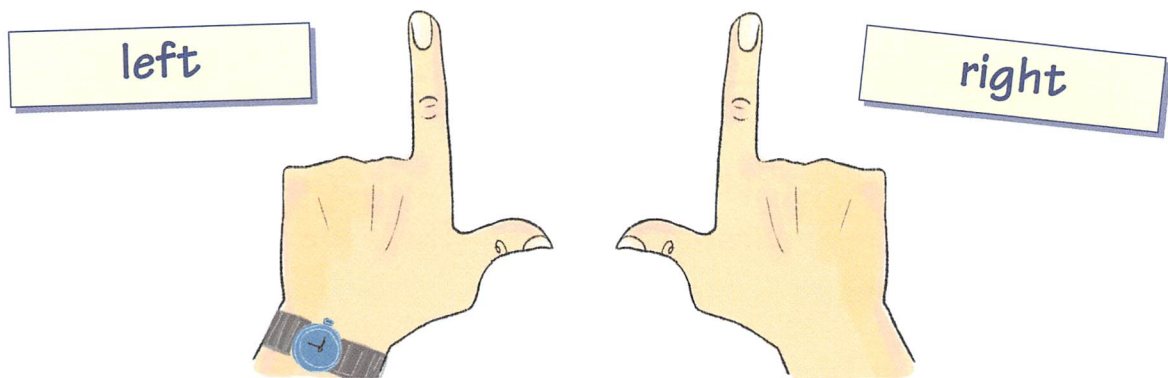
how many?

1, 2, 3, 4, 5 etc.

none = 0 (zero)

For the question "How many ...?", we answer with a number, or we say "none".

**How many toys has this boy got?***That boy's got 11 toys***How many toys has this boy got?***That boy's got none***How many books are there on the table?***There are ... books on the table***How many books are there on the floor?***There are none***How many legs has a bird got?***A bird's got two legs***How many legs has a spider got?***A spider's got eight legs***How many legs has a snake got?***A snake's got none***How many pictures are there on these walls?***There are ... pictures on these walls***How many pictures are there on that chair?***There are none*



Which hand's this?

*It's your left hand*

Which hand's this?

*It's your right hand*

Close your left eye, please.

What's she doing?

*She's closing her left eye*

Put your right hand on your left knee, please.

What's he doing?

*He's putting his right hand on his left knee*

Where are we now: at home or at school?

*We're at school now*

Have you got a pet at home?

*Yes, I've got a pet at home ~ No, I haven't got a pet at home*

How many *beds* are there in your *bedroom* at home?

*There's one bed in my bedroom at home ~ There are two (three etc.) beds in my bedroom at home*

Have you got a big *bedroom* or a small *bedroom*?

*I've got a ... bedroom*

What colour are the walls of your *bedroom*?

*The walls of my bedroom are ...*
