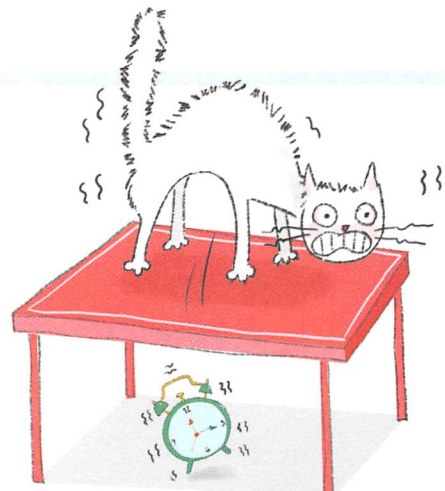


Is there a mouse on this chair?

Are there (12) chairs in this room?

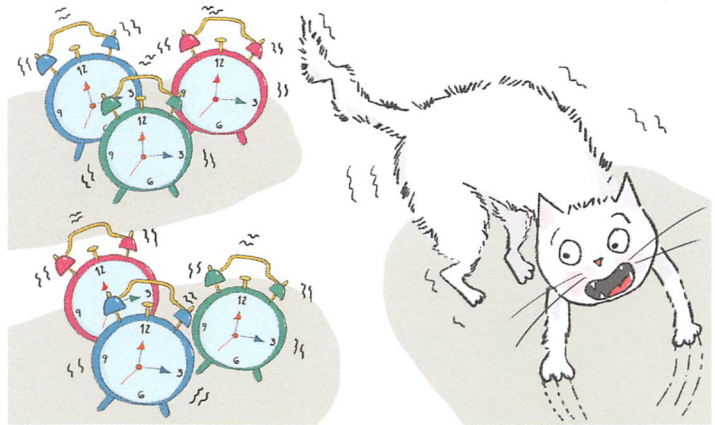
Yes, there are (12) chairs in this room
