What's the negative of "can"?

The negative of "can" is "cannot"

What's the contraction of "cannot"?

The contraction of "cannot" is "can't"



Can you touch the ceiling? No, I can't touch the ceiling

Can mice speak? No, mice can't speak

Can you spell the word ...?

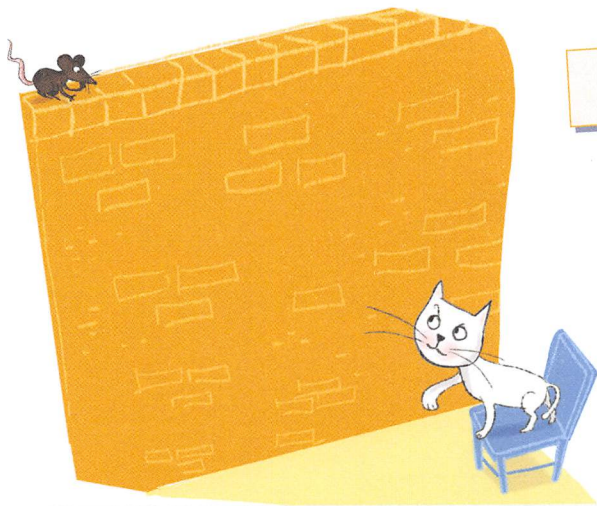
Yes, I can spell the word ... ~ No, I can't spell the word ...

“high” and “low” for things



What’s the difference between “tall” and “short” and “high” and “low”?

The difference between “tall” and “short” and “high” and “low” is that we use “tall” and “short” for people, and we use “high” and “low” for things

Is your chair high? No, my chair isn’t high; it’s low

Is the wall low? No, the wall isn’t low; it’s high

Is the ceiling in this room high or low?

The ceiling in this room is high

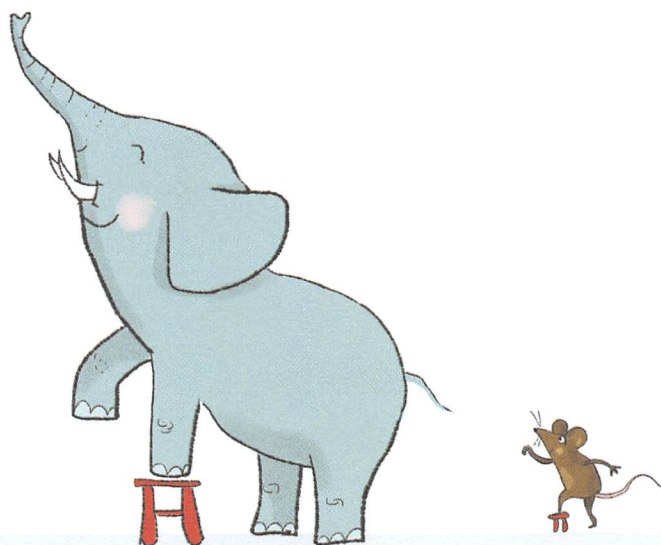

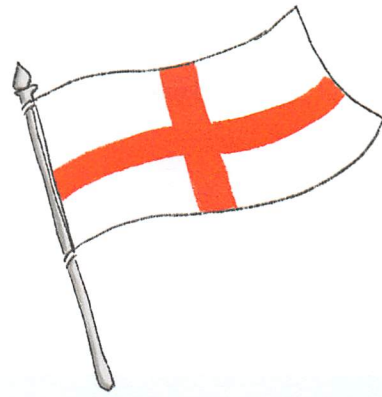
Is a mouse a very large animal?
