

How much is half of thirteen?


Half of thirteen is six and a half

What colour's water?

Water hasn't got any colour

Is there a drink on this table?

Yes there's a drink on that table ~ No, there isn't a drink on that table

Are tea and coffee drinks for children?

No tea and coffee aren't drinks for children; they're drinks for adults
