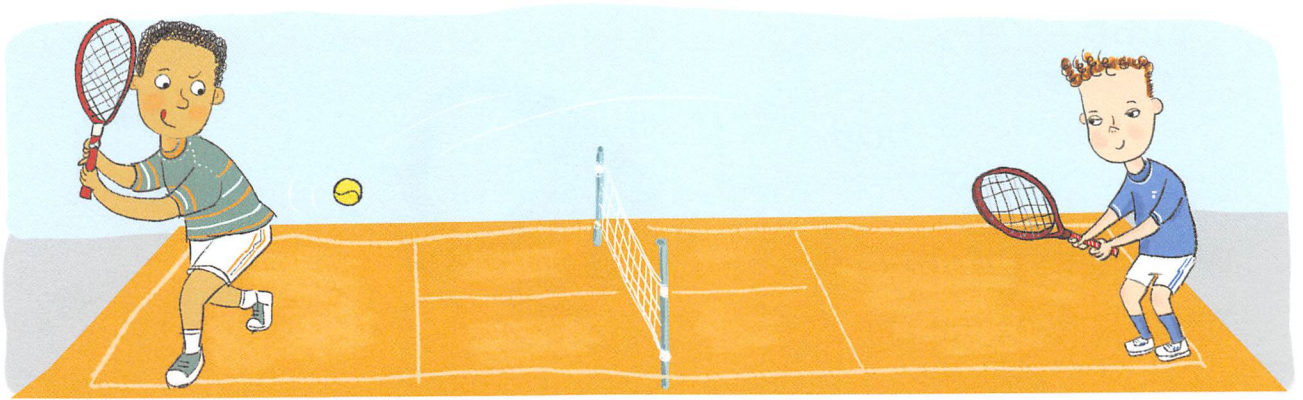

Is there anybody under the table?

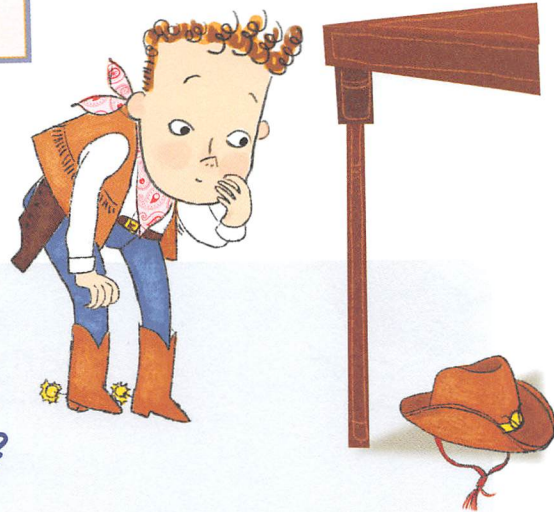
No, there isn't anybody under the table

Who's wearing a hat in this room?

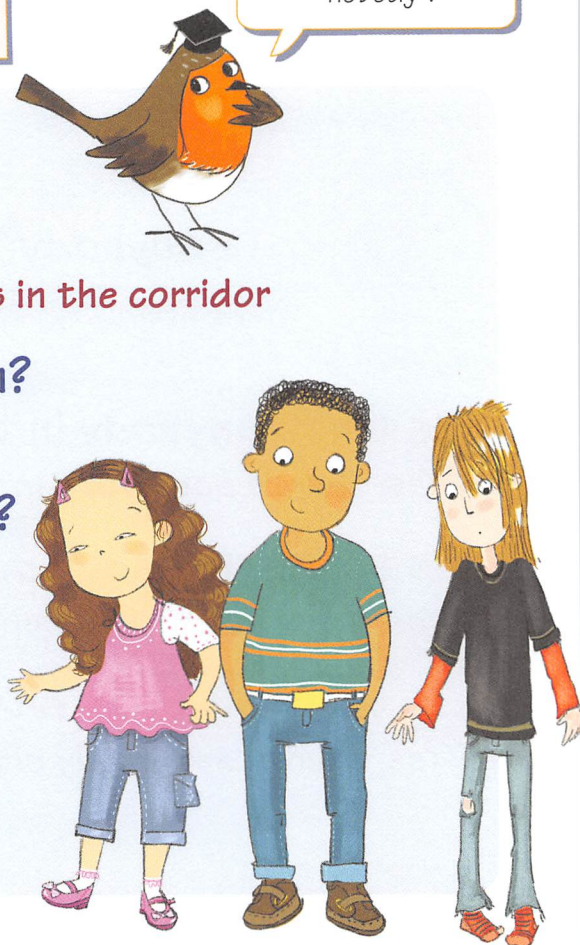
Nobody's wearing a hat in this room
