Are both your hands on your book?

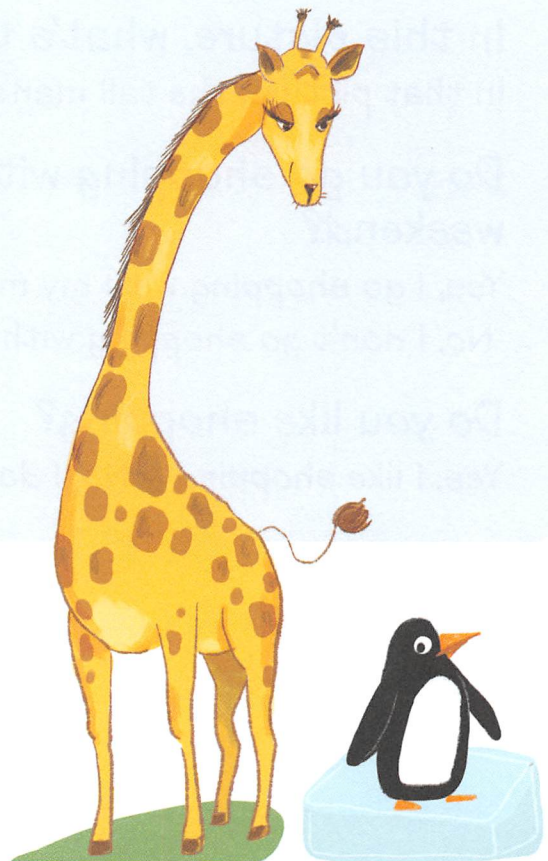
No, both my hands aren't on my book; one's on my book and the other's on my head

In this picture, what's the tall man carrying?

In that picture, the tall man's carrying his shopping

Do you go shopping with your mum (or dad) at the weekend?

Yes, I go shopping with my mum at the weekend ~

No, I don't go shopping with my mum at the weekend

Do you like shopping?

Yes, I like shopping ~ No, I don't like shopping

“why” in questions

“because” in

What's the difference between “why” and “because”?

The difference between “why” and “because” is that we generally use the word “why” in questions and “because” in answers

Can you jump up and touch the ceiling?

No, I can't jump up and touch the ceiling

Why not?

Because the ceiling's too high for me to touch

Can you put this book into your pocket?

No, I can't put that book into my pocket

Why not?

Because that book's too big to go into my pocket

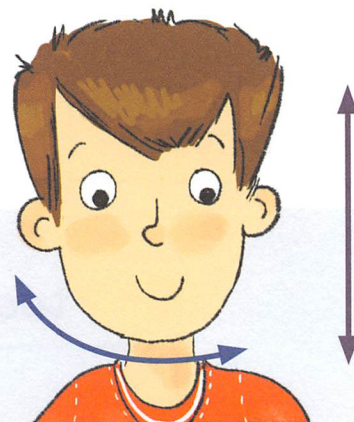
Why do we call Kate Best “Miss Best” and not “Mrs Best”?

We call Kate Best “Miss Best” and not “Mrs Best” because she isn't married

What are you doing?

I'm shaking hands with the pupils next to me

Do you think you're a nice person?

Yes, I think I'm a nice person

Do you eat nice food at home?

Yes, I eat nice food at home

Are sharks nice animals?

No, sharks aren't nice animals

Tell me the name of a nice animal, please.

A ... is a nice animal

Your nose is above your mouth

Where's my chin?

Your chin's below your mouth



Put your hands above your heads, please.

What are you doing?

We're putting our hands above our heads

Put your hands below your chairs, please.

What are you doing?

We're putting our hands below our chairs

Are my feet above the table?

No, your feet aren't above the table; they're below the table
