Yes, some people cry when they watch sad films

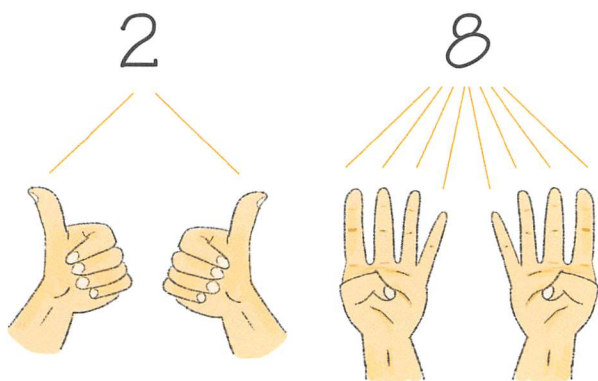

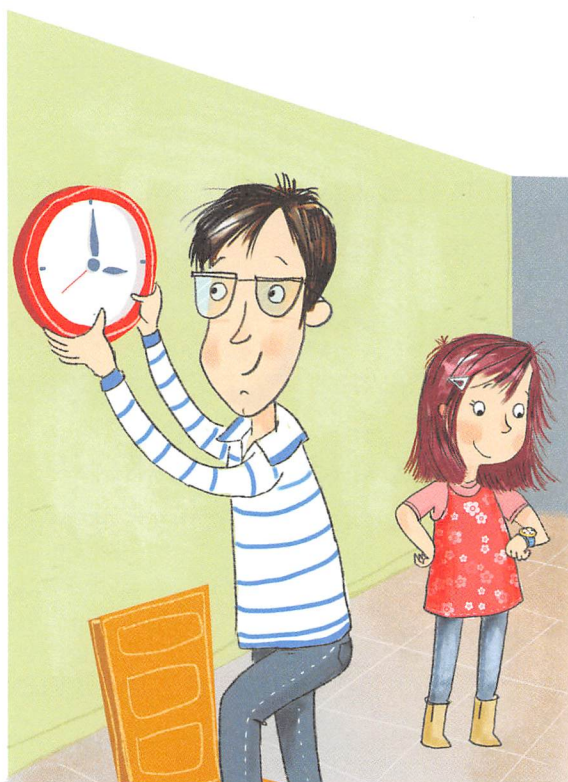
What's the difference between a watch and a clock?

The difference between a watch and a clock is that we wear a watch on our wrist, and we hang a clock on the wall or put it on a table

Am I wearing a watch?

Yes, you're wearing a watch ~

No, you aren't wearing a watch



Is there a clock in this room?

Yes, there's a clock in this room ~

No, there isn't a clock in this room

Where is it?

It's on the wall (or table)

What's the difference between "wear" and "carry"?

The difference between "wear" and "carry" is that we wear something on our body, and we carry something in our hands or in a pocket or bag

Do we carry a watch on our wrist?

No, we don't carry a watch on our wrist; we wear a watch on our wrist

Is the short woman carrying a hat?

No, the short woman isn't carrying a hat; she's wearing a hat

What's the tall man carrying?

The tall man's carrying some shopping (or food) in his bag

Go to the door with your book, please.

What's she carrying?

She's carrying her book
