Are there very many mice in a big city?

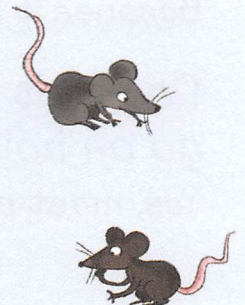
Yes, there are very many mice in a big city

capital letter

We use capital letters:

- at the beginning of a sentence
- for the word “I”
- for the first letter of people’s names and the names of places
- for the first letter of days and months
- for the first letter of nationalities and languages

Which of these words always has a capital letter: “I”, “you”, “he”, “she”, “it”, “we” or “they”?

Of those words, the word “I” always has a capital letter

In this sentence, which words start with a capital letter? “John goes to Spain for his holidays in August.”

In that sentence, “John”, “Spain” and “August” start with a capital letter

And which words start with a capital letter in this sentence? “They study maths on Wednesday and English at the weekend.”

In that sentence, “They”, “Wednesday” and “English” start with a capital letter
