#### Past tense of regular verbs

regular

question

Did you walk to school yesterday?

positive

Yes, I walk<u>ed</u> to school yesterday

negative

No, I did not walk to school yesterday

With some verbs, we make the past tense by adding the letters "ed".

They are called "regular" verbs.

"I talked to you last lesson."



## How do we make the past tense of regular verbs?

We make the past tense of regular verbs by adding the letters "ed"

Give me an example, please.

walked - I generally walk to school. I walked to school yesterday.

## Did Kate play a computer game with Sophie yesterday?

Yes, Kate played a computer game with Sophie yesterday

## Did Charlie and Dan chat with their friends yesterday?

Yes, Charlie and Dan chatted with their friends yesterday

Did your mother look after you when you were a baby? Yes, my mother looked after me when I was a baby

Who did you talk to at breakfast this morning? I talked to ... at breakfast this morning

When you were a very little child, did your mum help you to get dressed?

Yes, when I was a very little child, my mum helped me to get dressed

Did you enjoy your last holiday?

Yes, I enjoyed my last holiday


Did you remember to brush your teeth last night? Yes, I remembered to brush my teeth last night

Did you move any parts of your body during the last lesson?

Yes, I moved some parts of my body during the last lesson

For a question, put "did" before the verb, but don't add "ed"!

"Did you sneeze yesterday?"



"I <u>didn't</u> sneeze yesterday."





Did I ask you a thousand questions last lesson? No, you didn't ask me a thousand questions last lesson

Did last lesson end at 9 o'clock in the evening? No, last lesson didn't end at 9 o'clock in the evening; it ended at ...

Did you call anyone on a mobile phone yesterday? Yes, I called someone on a mobile phone yesterday ~ No, I didn't call anyone on a mobile phone yesterday

Did you want to come to school today?

Yes, I wanted to come to school today ~ No, I didn't want to come to school today

Did you kick a football last weekend?

Yes, I kicked a football last weekend ~ No, I didn't kick a football last weekend

Did Kate play on the beach yesterday afternoon? No, Kate didn't play on the beach yesterday afternoon

Did Charlie and Dan watch animals at the zoo yesterday?

No, Charlie and Dan didn't watch animals at the zoo yesterday


