## Hint 語彙力をつけるコツ

TOEIC Bridgeでは、文法に関する高度な知識が問われることはありません。Part IVの文法・語彙問題では、語法やコロケーションを扱った問題も出題されます。

語法というのは、それぞれの単語が持つ特性のひとつで、単語ごとに異なる用法を指します。たとえば、stopという動詞が「…をやめる」という意味で用いられるとき、目的語に従えるのは動名詞(-ing形)なので、「走るのをやめる」はstop runningとなり、stop to runとはならないといったことです。

コロケーションというのは、単語と単語の結び付きのことで、各単語が持つ語義と密接な関係を持っています。このコロケーションを誤ると不自然な英語となってしまいます。たとえば、「安価;安い値段」はcheap priceとは言わずlow priceとなることがこの例です。また「パーティーを開く」はopen a partyとは言わずthrow a partyあるいはhave [give / hold] a partyとなります。

このように、単語の意味を覚えるだけでなく、それぞれの単語が持つ特性や用例に配慮しながら、語彙力を伸ばすことが大切です。


