BERLIN, GERMANY ¹Do you ever feel lonely? Many people do, especially those who live by themselves. Holidays can be particularly hard for single people without families or companions. ²Two German women have developed something to help solve this problem. It's wallpaper*!

Their special wallpaper shows life-size photographs of people doing routine, everyday things like eating dinner or sitting on a sofa. When you hang a "wallpaper friend" in your house or apartment, you are no longer alone. "The wallpaper makes you feel like there are other people in the room," says one of the creators, Susanne Schmidt. 5Schmidt says that a great

advantage of wallpaper friends is that they always **behave** well. They won't **annoy** you by leaving dirty dishes in the kitchen.

6Single people in Germany are crazy about the new wallpaper and are buying lots of it. 7It is easy to put on or pull off your walls, so you can change "friends" frequently. 8Schmidt is now working on a new kind of wallpaper. It is for couples who are often apart and want a life-size copy of their husband or wife on the wall. A paper companion is better than none at all!

*wallpaper: special paper that you use to cover the walls of a room




