**PARIS, FRANCE** <sup>1</sup>Not so long ago, Ji Haye was a **confused** Korean teenager, **uncertain** about her future. She jumped from one subject\* to the next at universities in Seoul and Japan. <sup>2</sup>Then she went to fashion school. "This is it!" she thought and traveled to Paris, **eager** to make her **fortune**.

<sup>3</sup>Life there wasn't easy. For eight years she worked under famous **designers**, sewing their clothes, not hers. Many young designers just **give up**, but not Ji Haye. <sup>4</sup>She went home at night, **drew** her own **designs**, and went on dreaming.

<sup>5</sup>Then one day she received an invitation to show her clothes at a haute couture fashion show<sup>\*\*</sup> in Paris, along with big names like Chanel and Dior. <sup>6</sup>Designers **prepare** a whole year for this 15-minute show, and most have help from the best workers. **7**"But ... there was no one to help me," says Ji Haye. She did every **detail** herself. She worked 20-hour days, pushing and pulling a **needle** until her arms were swollen\*\*\*.

<sup>8</sup>Now Ji Haye is a star in Paris, famous for her colorful clothes using Korean **material** and **traditional** Korean designs. She says it's hard work to stay on top. "I always live like I'm standing at the edge of a cliff."


