

QUEBEC, CANADA ¹Tom loves to paint with a brush. His paintings explode with feeling. ²Binky would rather paint with his fingers and feet. He smiles the whole time that he is working. Binky and Tom are artists, but they're also chimpanzees*! ³These chimps and four of their friends have shown their work in galleries** in the Canadian cities of Toronto and Montreal. ⁴Many people have enjoyed their work. "It's so strong and sensitive," said one person. "You can really see their feelings." Their work sold, too. Buyers paid between \$500 and \$1,800 for a painting.

⁵Before they became artists, the chimps had a **cruel** life. They were used for many years as test animals in **laboratories** and had become weak and

sick. "It's so sad what happened to the chimps," says a Montreal art buyer.

6Now the chimps are in a better situation, living happily on Gloria Grow's farm with llamas*** and other animals. 7The clever chimps can use sign language and tools. They also enjoy watching TV and hanging upside-down in trees. 8Since the chimps get bored so easily, Grow decided to make their lives better by giving them a hobby. "Binky gets this great big smile on his face," she says, "when you come near him with the paints."


