**TOEFL® Tip:**

There is no need for two subjects to be used with the same verb. Whenever you see a pronoun (such as he, she, they, it, you, we), be sure the referent nouns are either not there, or in a different clause.

**English Tip:**

Subject can be:

Single word → School, Mary, USA

Article + noun → The student, a rabbit, some money

Adjective + noun → The black tiger, The big cat

Tropical (adjective): From the tropics

Renowned (Adjective): Known

Reliable (adjective): Good

Dietary (Adjective): Good for a diet

**TOEFL® Tip:**

You need to be aware of countable and uncountable nouns. When you find an underlined countable noun with “s”, you should ask yourself “Is this noun countable?”

**English Tip:**

Some common uncountable nouns include: water, love, money, milk, vocabulary, peace, or honey. Uncountable animals include: fish, deer, salmon, sheep, and trout. So, as an example, there is nothing called ‘fishs’. You can use the word ‘fish’ as plural or singular, depending on the meaning of the sentence.
