**TOEFL® Tip:**

In English, there are two and three part verbs (phrasal verbs), and some of them appear in the Listening Part A. The verb might have a different meaning when it's combined to a different another word. For example, push forward (to do something difficult), push back (to move time back), push around (to treat someone unfairly), push off (to go away), push on (to continue).
