TOEFL® Tip:

Negative is very common in listening Part A. In some of these negative questions, the answer might be just a paraphrase of the meaning. For example, in the previous question "not as expected" means it wasn't interesting.

Negative words and expressions include: No, never, nobody, none, nothing, nowhere, never, ever, neither... nor, little, hardly, scarcely.
