

1 When you are talking about a particular group of people or things you can use these patterns:

All of the children enjoyed the party. All of us enjoyed the party.
They didn't eat all of the cakes. They didn't eat all of them.
We picked some of the flowers. We picked some of them.

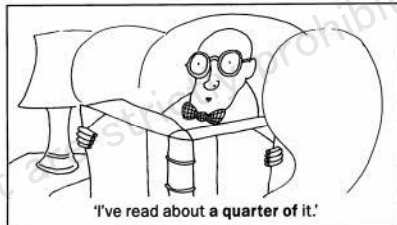
2 When you are talking about two you use *both*:

Both of the girls stayed at home. Both of them stayed at home.

You use *neither* for the negative:

Neither of the boys stayed at home. Neither of you stayed at home.

3 You can use numbers and fractions with these patterns:



About half of the pupils are girls. Two of them were very big, and one was quite small.

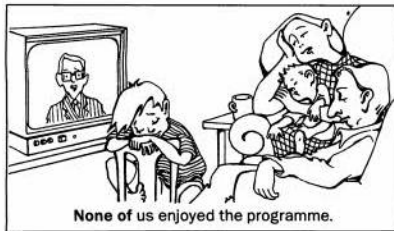
4 You can also use these expressions:

For more than half: I know most of the people in your class.

For a small number or amount: I've got some new magazines. Would you like to borrow a few of them?

For none: none of not ... any of



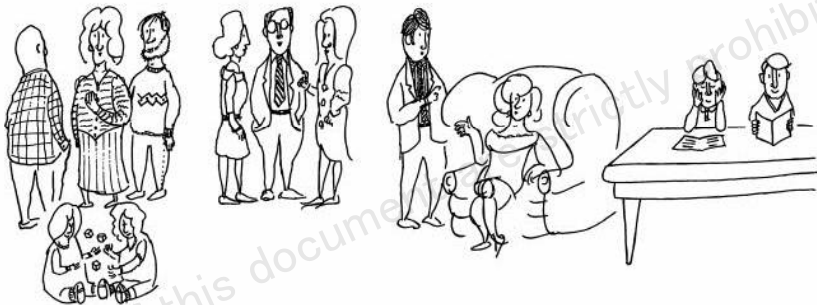
