1 a few means the same as some:

We were quite tired so a few of us went to bed early.



few means the same as not many:

They were all very excited. Few of them went to bed before midnight.

It was a dreadful accident. Few passengers survived.

2 You can use any with count or uncount nouns:

You use any in positive statements when you mean any one at all or when you mean it doesn't matter which one:


You can buy it at any book shop. You can hire a car at almost any airport.

Any ten year-old knows how to use a computer. I'd like any book by Jane Austen.

Because it has this meaning it is very common in negatives and questions:

There aren't any tomatoes left. There's some sugar, but there isn't any rice.





But you usually use some in requests and offers because they are for specific things: Could you lend me some money? Could I have some tomatoes please?
