# Likes/dislikes/invitations

## I To talk about liking or disliking something, you use verb + -ing with:

enjoy like love feel like fancy dislike detest hate mind



Do you enjoy skiing?



My cousin loves watching football on TV.



trictly prohibited

I hated cooking when I was younger, but I liked eating out.

I fancy having a night out tonight. What about you?

Do you feel like coming to the cinema with us, Dave?

# To invite someone to do something you can use:

a How about + -ing: How about coming with us to the cinema? How about having a meal with us later on in the week?

Note: You can use this structure with a noun: How about another drink? How about a trip to London?

- Would you like to have something to eat? Would you like to come to the party?
- c You must + infinitive without to: You really must have some more ice-cream.



You must visit us when you're in Hong Kong.

- d To make an informal invitation to a friend, you can also use an imperative sentence, or, for extra emphasis, an imperative with do before the main verb:
- A 'Have a sandwich.'

- B "I shouldn't."
- B 'Oh, do take one.'
- A 'Come any time you like.'
- B 'We'll try.'
- A 'Yes, do come.'
