

Make/let/help + plain infinitive

1 You use make with the plain infinitive (the infinitive without to) to:

- a talk about how you feel because of someone or something:
 The film was so sad. It made me cry. (= I cried because of the film)
 You always make me feel happy. (= I am happy because of you)
 I had to wait an hour to see the doctor. That made me want to complain.
 (= I wanted to complain because of the wait)
- b talk about doing something because someone tells or forces you:









He made me sit down.

You can't make me eat it.

They made me wait for hours.

I didn't want to see the film, but they made me go.

2 You use let with the plain infinitive:

a to say that someone allows someone to do something:
He let me go home early.
Shut up and let me talk!
'Let me help you'.
When I was young, my parents never let me go out alone:

b to make a suggestion about doing something:
Let's go to the theatre tonight.
Let's have an ice-cream.
Let's not walk, let's take a taxi.

3 You use help with the plain infinitive:

Thanks for helping me clean the car, John. Your explanation helped me understand the problem.

You can also use help with the to-infinitive:



She helped me to choose a shirt.



'Thanks for helping me to clean the car.'
