
57 Phrasal verbs

f 1 Many verbs consist of more than one word in English. Generally these verbs are verb + particle (in/on/out/off etc). These are called phrasal verbs. A phrasal verb does not have the same meaning as the normal verb:

2 A common structure is verb + particle:

get by go on go away grow up keep on meet up watch out

I can speak a little French. I can get by.
I'm sorry I interrupted your story. Please go on.
The music was so bad we paid the musicians to go away.
We grew up in the countryside, but now we live in the city.
It's hard to succeed, but you must keep on trying.
They visited different shops, then met up at the library.



There's a policeman coming. Watch out!
