

You also use enough after adjectives and adverbs:

You are old enough to know what is right. Can you hear? Am I speaking loud enough?

I've cooked enough cakes for everyone to have some.

My French is good enough for me to understand people.

You are not old enough to see that film.

You use too to say there is more than necessary, or more than is acceptable:

a too + adjective/adverb: I like that picture, but I thin

I like that picture, but I think it's too expensive. You can't walk from here to the beach! It's too far. I'm not surprised you feel sick. You ate too quickly!

b too + many/few + plural countable noun: There were too many people. We couldn't sit down.

The hotel is closed in winter because we have too few visitors.

Be careful: you don't say too + adj + noun: NOT: These are too expensive shoes. BUT: These shoes are too expensive.

c too + much/little + uncountable noun:

We didn't see the museum because we had **too little time**. This tea is terrible. You put **too much sugar** in it!
