

somebody / someone = a person, but we don't know who



She has got something in her mouth.

something = a thing, but we don't know what



Tom lives **somewhere** near Chicago.

somewhere = in/to a place, but we don't know where

People (-body or -one)

somebody or someone

anybody or anyone

nobody or no one

- There is somebody (or someone) at the door.
- Is there anybody (or anyone) at the door?
- There isn't anybody (or anyone) at the door.
- There is nobody (or no one) at the door.

-body and -one are the same: somebody = someone, nobody = no one, etc.

Things (-thing)

something

Lucy said something, but I didn't understand what she said.

anything

Are you doing anything this weekend?
 I was angry, but I didn't say anything.

nothing

"What did you say?" "Nothing."

Places (-where)

somewhere

Ruth's parents live somewhere in Southern California.

anywhere

Did you go anywhere interesting on vacation?

nowhere

- I'm staying here. I'm not going anywhere.
- I don't like this town. There is nowhere to go.

C

something / anybody, etc. + adjective (big/cheap/interesting, etc.)

- Did you meet anybody interesting at the party?
- We always go to the same place. Let's go somewhere different.
- "What's in that letter?" "It's nothing important."

D

something / anybody, etc. + to ...

- I'm hungry. I want something to eat. (= something that I can eat)
- Tony doesn't have anybody to talk to. (= anybody that he can talk to)
- There is nowhere to go in this town. (= nowhere where people can go)
