

## Superlatives - the longest / the most enjoyable, etc.

Study these examples:

- What is the longest river in the world?
- What is the most enjoyable vacation you've ever had?

Longest and most enjoyable are superlative forms.

В

The superlative form is -est or most . . . . In general, we use -est for short words and most . . . for longer words. (The rules are the same as those for the *comparative* – see Unit 101.)

long → longest easy → easiest hard → hardest  $hot \rightarrow hottest$ but most famous most difficult most expensive most boring

These adjectives are irregular:

far → farthest/furthest  $good \rightarrow best$ bad → worst

For spelling, see Appendix 5.

C

We normally use the before a superlative (the longest / the most famous, etc.):

- Yesterday was the hottest day of the year.
- That movie was really boring. It was the most boring movie I've ever seen.
- She is a really nice person one of the nicest people I know.
- Why does he always come to see me at the worst possible moment?

Compare:

- This hotel is the cheapest in town. (superlative)
- This hotel is cheaper than all the others in town. (comparative)

D

Oldest and eldest

The superlative of old is oldest:

That church is the oldest building in the town. (not the eldest)

You can use eldest or oldest to talk about people in a family:

- My eldest son is 13 years old. (or My oldest son)
- Are you the eldest in your family? (or the oldest)

E

After superlatives we use in with places (towns, buildings, etc.):

- What is the longest river in the world? (not of the world)
- We had a great room. It was one of the nicest in the hotel. (not of the hotel)

We also use in for organizations and groups of people (a class, a company, etc.):

Who is the best student in the class? (not of the class)

We normally use of for a period of time:

- What was the happiest day of your life?
- Yesterday was the hottest day of the year.

F

We often use the *present perfect* (I have done) after a superlative (see also Unit 8A):

- What's the best movie you've ever seen?
- That was the most delicious meal I've had in a long time.
