## Like and as

A

Like = similar to, the same as:

- What a beautiful house! It's like a palace. (not as a palace)
- What does Sandra do?" "She's a teacher, like me." (not as me)
- Be careful! The floor has been polished. It's like walking on ice. (not as walking)
- We heard a noise like a baby crying. (not as a baby crying)

In these sentences, like is a preposition. So it is followed by a noun (like a palace), a pronoun (like me), or -ing (like walking). You cannot use as in these sentences.

Sometimes like = "for example." You can also use such as:

Some sports, like race-car driving, can be dangerous. or Some sports, such as race-car driving, can be dangerous.

В

We use as (= in the same way) before a subject + verb:

- I didn't move anything. I left everything as I found it. (= the way I found it)
- You should have done it as I showed you. (= the way I showed you)

You can also use like in these sentences, especially in informal speech:

I left everything like I found it.

Compare like and as:

- You should have done it like this. (not as this)
- You should have done it as I showed you or ... like I showed you.

Note that we say as usual / as always:

You're late as usual.

C

Sometimes as (+ subject + verb) has other meanings. For example, after do:

- Please do as I say. (= do what I say)
- They did as they promised. (= they did what they promised)

We also say as you know / as I was saying / as she expected / as I thought, etc.:

- As you know, it's Tom's birthday next week. (= you know it's his birthday)
  - Ann failed her driving test, as she expected. (= she expected this)

You can also say like I was saying / like I said, but generally like is not used in the other expressions (as you know, etc.).

D

As can also be a preposition, but the meaning is different from like. Compare:

- Brenda Casey is the manager of a company. As the manager, she has to make many important decisions. (As the manager = in her position as the manager)
- Mary Stone is the assistant manager. Like the manager (Brenda Casey), she also has to make important decisions. (Like the manager = similar to the manager)

As (preposition) = in the position of, in the form of, etc.:

- A few years ago I worked as a bus driver. (not like a bus driver)
- We've got a garage, but we don't have a car, so we use the garage as a workshop.
- Many English words (for example, "work" and "rain") can be used as verbs or nouns.
- New York is all right as a place to visit, but I wouldn't like to live there.
- The news of her death came as a great shock.
